

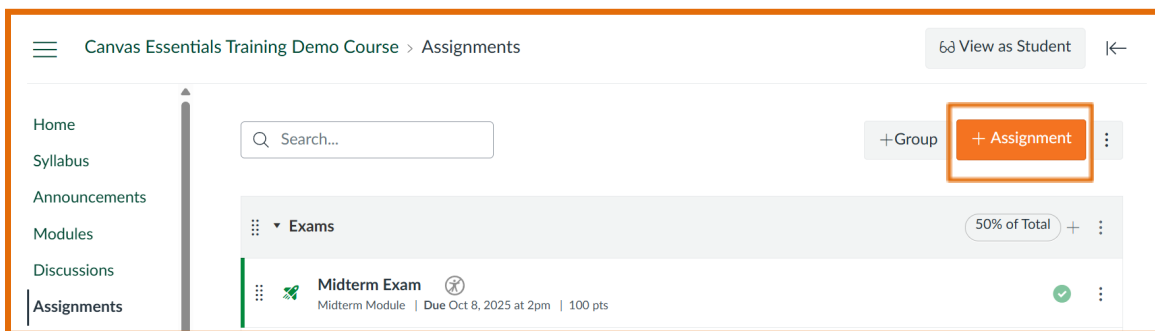

Creating Assignments with Lucid

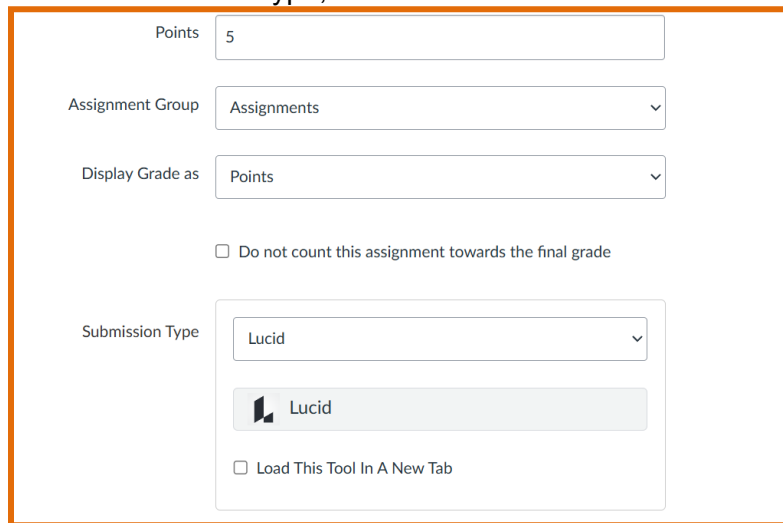
Canvas allows instructors to create interactive assignments using **Lucidspark** or **Lucidchart** directly within the site. Students can brainstorm, diagram, map ideas, collaborate visually, or complete structured templates as part of a graded submission.

Creating Assignment

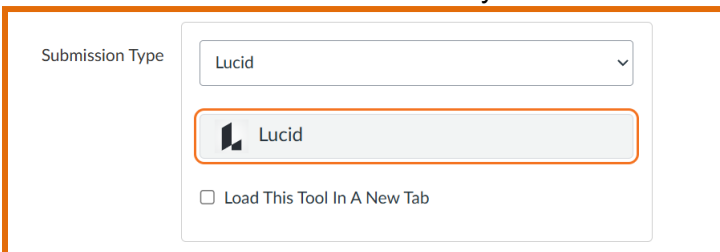
1. Open your course in Canvas
2. Navigate to **Assignments** and select **+Assignment** in the right hand corner.



3. Enter the Assignment Details
4. Under Submission Type, select **Lucid**

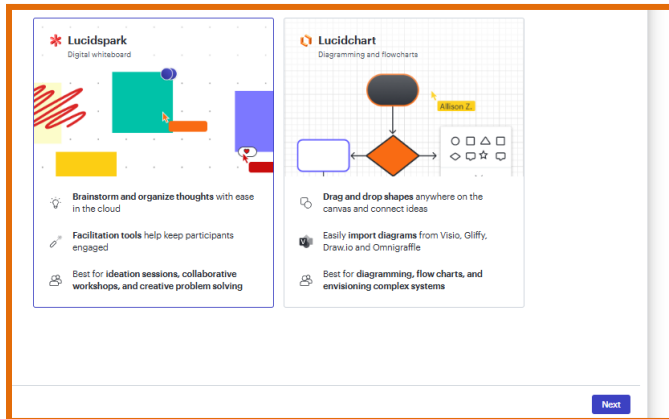

5. Select the button underneath that says **Lucid**

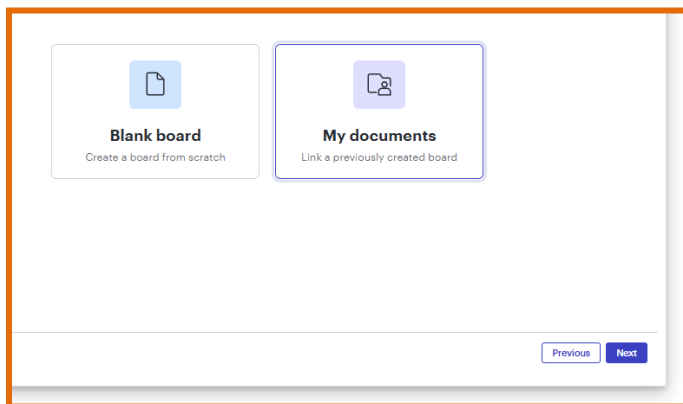

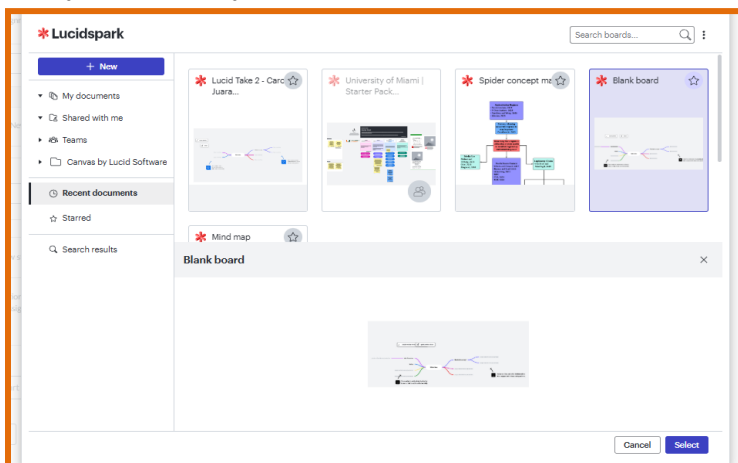
6. In the new pop up, choose either **Lucidspark** or **Lucidchart**, depending on the type of assignment you are creating, click **Next**



7. Select whether to create a **Blank Board** or choose from **My Documents**, click **Next**

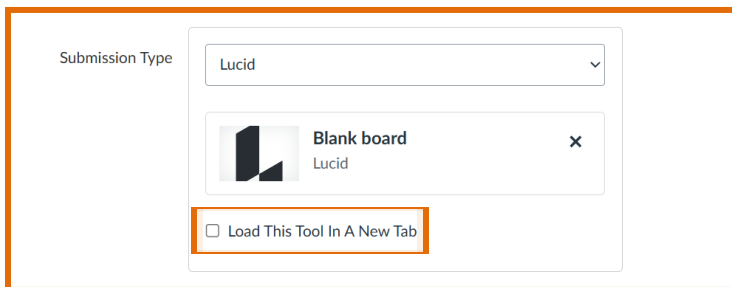


8. If you chose My Documents, choose which document (template) to upload, click **Select**



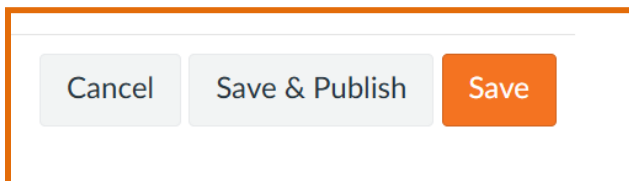
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9. If you want students to load the Lucid assignment in another tab rather than within Canvas, select **Load This Tool In A New Tab**

11. Click **Save** or **Save & Publish**

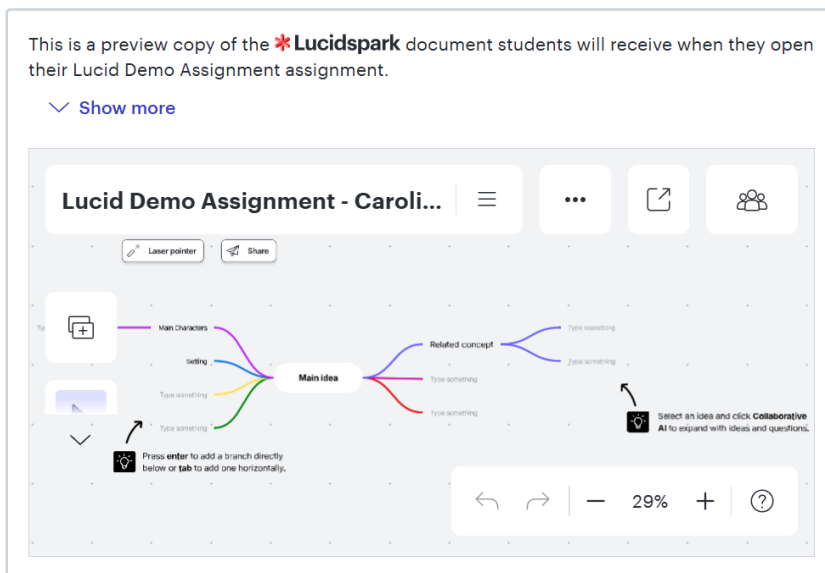


The screenshot shows three buttons: 'Cancel', 'Save & Publish', and 'Save'. The 'Save' button is highlighted with an orange border.

Students will then open the assignment in Canvas and complete their Lucidspark and Lucidchart directly through the site. Each student receives their own copy of the selected Lucid document or board to complete and submit.

- Students may need to connect their free Lucid account the first time they access a Lucid assignment.
- Submissions can be reviewed and graded in SpeedGrader.
- Edits made after submission may not appear in SpeedGrader unless the student resubmits.
