

# Enabling Turnitin's Plagiarism Framework on a Canvas Assignment

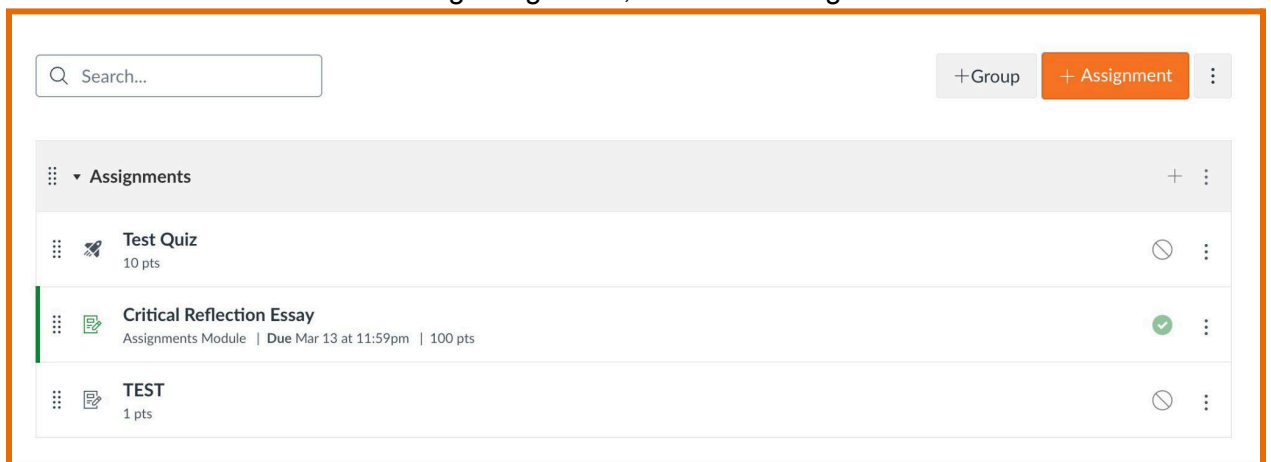
## What is Turnitin Plagiarism Framework?

Turnitin can be enabled within a Canvas assignment to provide a Similarity Report for student submissions. This report highlights text that may match online sources, publications, or previously submitted work, helping instructors quickly review originality.

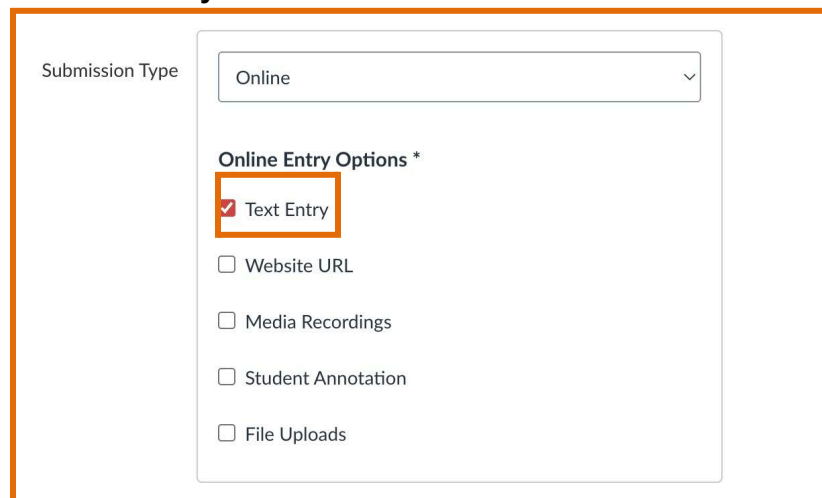
Unlike the full Turnitin Feedback Studio, this integration is used solely for plagiarism review. It does not include in-document commenting, QuickMarks, or rubric-based grading within Turnitin. Instead, all grading and feedback remain within Canvas using SpeedGrader and Canvas tools.

## Enabling Turnitin Framework within a Canvas Assignment

1. To enable Turnitin within an existing assignment, select the assignment and select edit:



2. Scroll to submission type and:
  - a. Select **Online**
  - b. Check off **Text Entry**

3. Scroll further and in **Plagiarism Review**, select **Turnitin Plagiarism Framework**.

4. Select your preferred settings and **Save** the assignment after editing. You can choose whether:
- The student submission is saved within the Turnitin repository
  - What the student submission will be compared to
    - Student repository: The Turnitin repository where student submissions will be compared to other student submissions from Turnitin
    - Website content
    - Periodicals, journals, and publication
  - To exclude portions of the student student submission in the originality report.
  - When to show the report to students (either immediately or when scores are published).
