



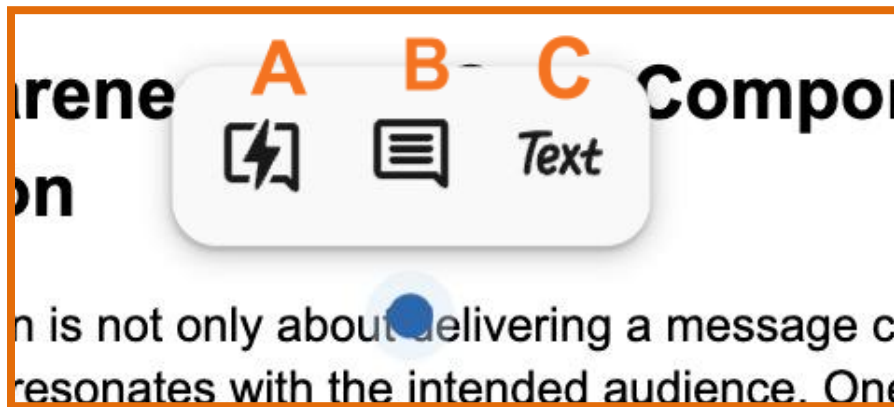
Feedback and QuickMarks

What is Turnitin and why is it used?

Turnitin Feedback Studio is available to help instructors review student submissions for originality and provide targeted, in-document feedback. Feedback Studio supports inline comments, QuickMarks, rubrics, and overall feedback, making it a useful tool for promoting academic integrity while streamlining the grading and feedback process.

Feedback and QuickMarks


1. There are **three** types of feedback in Turnitin.
 - a. **QuickMarks**
 - i. Pre-written, reusable comments that help streamline grading by allowing you to quickly add common feedback
 - b. **Comment**
 - i. You can leave a comment on a part of a student's paper and it will show up in the margins.
 - c. **Inline Comment**
 - i. Allow you to leave personalized feedback directly within the student's paper.



2. To add a comment:
 - a. Click where you want the comment to appear.
 - b. Select the icon according to the type of comment you'd like to add
 - c. Type your feedback directly on the document
 - d. Save your comment.
