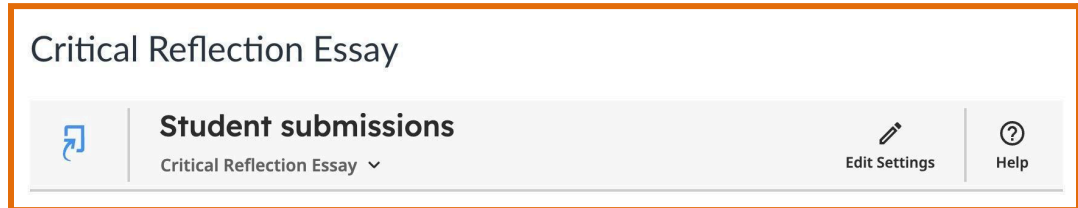


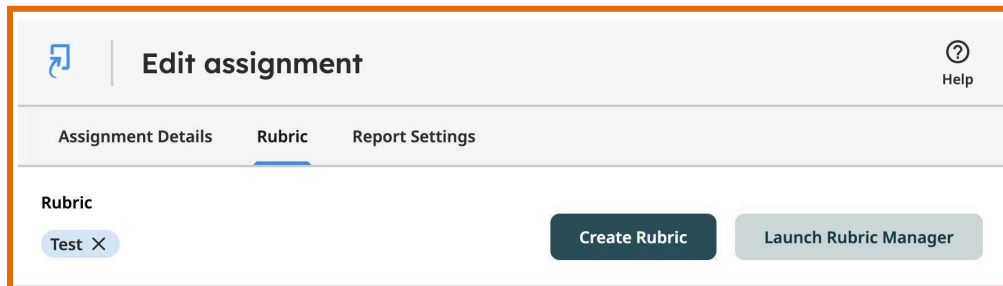
Rubrics in Turnitin

Rubrics provide structured grading criteria and promote transparent, consistent assessment.


1. To Create a Rubric
 - a. Open the assignment
 - b. Navigate to the **Turnitin Settings**



- c. Select **Rubric**
 - d. Click **Create Rubric**



- e. Choose the rubric style
